

Guidelines for COVID-19 Safety Precautions
McPherson Area Habitat for Humanity (MAHFH)
2020 Build – 403 S Oak

Thank you for volunteering on this year's Habitat build! We are taking extra precautions this year to make your experience as safe as is possible as we together make efforts to halt the spread of Coronavirus "COVID-19" in our community. Our intent is to follow the recommendations from the Centers for Disease Control & Prevention (CDC), Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA), Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE), McPherson County Health Department and Habitat for Humanity International. If you have any questions about these guidelines or the use of the Personal Protection Equipment (PPE) provided you should contact the site supervisor on this project.

Please review the following guidelines-

- **If you do not feel well, please stay home as a precaution and consult your doctor as needed.** People of any age with medical conditions such as lung or heart disease, diabetes or autoimmune deficiencies are at higher risk of developing more serious complications from COVID-19 and should seek care as soon as any symptoms start
- As is possible, we will be testing the body temperatures of those on the job site as they arrive and recording the names, temperatures, time and the task you are performing for tracking purposes. Those not meeting the acceptable scale of 97°F – 99.5°F will be asked to leave the site. **If you do not feel well, please stay home.**
- Items such as a hand wash station, gloves, face coverings, disinfectant dispensers and sanitary trash receptacles will be provided and maintained at our site.
- As much as is possible, maintain 6 feet of distance from others. If distancing is not possible, face coverings are recommended and provided.
- Personal hygiene such as washing your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds every couple of hours is also highly recommended. A hand wash station is provided on site. The use of approved disinfecting solutions on your hands and frequently touched surfaces is recommended and will be provided.
- Avoid touching your face with your hands, shaking hands with others and sharing tools. MAHFH will be cleaning/disinfecting the tools that we provide on the job site at a minimum of once per day. We are happy to provide that same service upon request for contractors and volunteers with tools they bring to the worksite.
- The number of contractors and volunteers on site at any given time will be limited as follows:
 - Outside projects – 45 people (Kansas Phase 3 recommendation), or at the discretion of the site supervisor to maintain safe distancing.
 - Inside projects – 12 people
- Bottled water and pre-packaged snacks will be provided on site, but lunches will be the responsibility of the volunteer.
- Each volunteer will be required to review this information and sign a waiver of liability form.

Thank you for helping us to achieve our goal in keeping everyone safe on our job location.
